In news from the entertainment world, we learn that Hollywood has lost one of its greatest stars. The family of Annika Berg announced that she passed away peacefully at her Santa Monica home yesterday evening.

Annika Berg appeared in her first film in 1946, when she was 17 years old. Her film career, however, would be a short one, lasting only 19 years. In 1965, at the age of 36, she made the last of her 27 movies, a romantic drama called *A Lady from the East*. The movie was poorly received and she announced that she would take a vacation from movie making for a while. She never returned to the screen.

Though Ms. Berg had not appeared in a movie in almost half of a century, her fans never forgot her. This is all the more surprising because she never gave interviews, she never signed autographs, and she never answered any of the mail she got from her many fans. She would not even attend ceremonies at which she won awards. Rather than appearing in public, she chose to spend her time quietly with family and a small circle of close friends. Ms. Berg's most famous movie line was "I want to be alone." Both during her time as an actress and afterwards, this line accurately describes the kind of life she wanted to live.

## Passage 3

Thank you for joining today's tour of Stratford House, the former home of our city's most famous painter, Jenny Smith. First, a brief introduction to Jenny herself.

Her talent was clear from a young age and she was invited to study with the famous painter Paolo Micasso from 1957 to 1962. Her best-known works all came after this time, with her most famous piece, "Silver Birches", selling to a private collector for over three million dollars in 1993.

We'll then enter the gallery, which is the small building next to the pond, where some of Jenny Smith's most famous works can be seen. Jenny offered some of her paintings for sale through auctions and sold some directly to private collectors. However, she donated the majority to museums so that as many people as possible could enjoy her work. She kept back a few favourite pieces though, which we will see later in the gallery.

- M: There are those who have a natural talent for acting, but we all need to develop it further. Going to acting school really helped me. Studying great actors on your own can help as well. More than that, and the essential thing, I would say, is to seek out people who will support you. I mean, as an actor you have to be prepared for a lot of rejection, so it's important to have others who encourage you. Also, try to be realistic about what you can achieve. Start out slow. Give yourself time.
