This is a test of your listening ability. Listen to the recordings and select the best answer from choices A to D. Mark your answers from 49 to 65 on the answer sheet. There are two sections to the test; section A and section B. Section A has 10 questions; section B has 3 passages. Passages 1 and 2 have 2 questions each and passage 3 has 3 questions. In both sections you will hear the recordings only once. Mark your answer as soon as each recording has finished. You will have about 10 seconds to answer each question. You are encouraged to make notes on the question paper as you listen.

Section A. In section A you will hear 10 dialogs. For each one choose the best answer to the question you hear. Listen to the following example.

W: Can we leave now?

M: Wait. I'm not ready. Don't worry we won't be late. It's 2 hours before the movie starts.

W: I know, but the traffic into the city is always very heavy at this time of the evening.

M: Okay. I'll be ready in a minute.

Question: Why does the woman want to leave soon? The correct answer is C.

Now we will begin the test.

Dialog 1

Good morning, shoppers! We have great news for MaxiClothes customers this week. Everything in our store is 10% off until next Sunday. Dialog 2

Passage 1

Good evening, ladies and gentlemen. On behalf of Air Canada I'd like to welcome you aboard flight 99 from Tokyo to Vancouver. We apologize for the 30-minute delay to our original departure time of 6:30 pm. Even though we departed at 7:00 pm, we still anticipate arriving on time at 11:30 am local time in Vancouver. Our flight time is normally about 9 hours, but we have clear skies and anticipate making up lost time. For your reference, it is currently 7:15 pm Tokyo time and 3:15 am Vancouver time.

The cabin crew will be coming around shortly to offer you a choice of drinks from our beverage service. Soon after, a choice of hot meals will be offered during our dinner service. Following your meal, our duty-free shopping service will begin. Duty-free items can be found in your duty-free shopping catalogue in the backrest of the seat in front of you. A few hours prior to landing, we will be serving a light breakfast, and our cabin crew will then pass out the immigration forms that you will need to fill in prior to entering Canada. Passage 2

In today's evening news, the New Brighton City Council announced that a new law was passed requiring all bicycle riders to wear approved bicycle helmets. This law is a response to the recent increase in the number of head injuries from cycling accidents. City officials have said that they are determined to reverse this trend. From tomorrow, posters and other advertisements will be put up around the city to inform riders of this new law. Police officers will also be cycling around town to remind cyclists of the law. Information about different types of approved bicycle helmets, including how to properly fit and wear them, will be printed and passed on to schools and will be available from the city hall next month. In the meantime, the information about helmets is available online from today on the New Brighton City Council website.

After the law takes effect, people riding a bicycle without a proper helmet will not be fined during the first two months, but police officers will issue a written warning to them. After that time, anyone stopped without a helmet will have to pay a fine of \$20 for the first offence. Repeat offenders will then have to pay a \$40 fine for each additional violation. If a fine is not paid within 30 days, the charge will double to a maximum of \$80. So, please be sure to wear a helmet while riding your bicycle.
