Based upon the University's admissions policy, in addition to requiring its students to possess sufficient basic academic ability to complete a course of study in our Faculty, in order to select people with the characteristics stated below, the Faculty of Policy Studies carries out the examinations such as the General Entrance Examination, the *Zengaku Toitsu Nyushi* (Unified Entrance Examination) (Individual Academic Ability type & Center Combined type), Center examinations, entrance examinations for recommended students and screening (Nanzan Gakuen secondary schools, Catholic secondary schools and other designated secondary schools).

- People interested in the various issues faced by society in terms of international relations, politics, economics or the environment.
- People interested in the history or culture of a specific region and who seek to understand a diverse range of values.
- People seeking to go beyond learning in the classroom, wanting to step out to see matters with their own eyes and learn from experiences in the field.
- People wishing to actively communicate with people from a range of countries and regions.

In the General Entrance Examination, the *Zengaku Toitsu Nyushi* (Unified Entrance Examination) (Individual Academic Ability type & Center Combined type), and the Center examinations, the main focus is to evaluate the basic academic ability required to study in our Faculty. In the entrance examinations for recommended students, in addition to basic academic ability, we evaluate the clarity of the aim motivating the student to study in our Faculty, the extent to which the student possesses relevant specialist knowledge, as well as the student's skills in the areas of oral and written presentation, logical thinking and judgment.
