I strongly believe that this sense of unity will be the strongest counter balance to division and intolerance. We, as Gen Z, have the power to change the world, and have a responsibility to do so.

In addition to these discussions, we also had opportunities to enjoy the beautiful scenery and rich culture of Taichung. My personal favorite was the visit to the Taichung Gaomei Wetlands. We went there in the early evening, and the sunset was so beautiful. I took many pictures, enjoyed walking through the natural setting and talking with my new friends. The wetlands became one of the most memorable places I have ever visited.
