Dialog 1

M: Where do you want to go for lunch, Kathy?

W: Well, my friend Tony said the new French restaurant near the train station is pretty good.

M: Isn't it expensive? I heard that their lunch special is two thousand yen. I was thinking of something a little cheaper than the French restaurant.

W: Yeah, okay. How about the ramen shop? It's pretty reasonable.

- M: Yeah, that'd be fine. But they're closed on Tuesdays.
- W: Oh, right.
- M: There's always the Okinawan restaurant across the street ...
- W: Yeah, I ate there last week. I guess I could go there again. Let's see ... there's also the pasta place, but we probably don't have enough time to go there.
- M: Yeah, it *is* a little far away. Listen, I've got some extra money. Let's just go to the place your friend suggested.
- W: Are you sure?
- M: Yeah, let's go.

Dialog 2

- M: It's just us for dinner tonight, Mary. Mum has to work late.
- W: Well, let's have pizza, dad.
- M: We had that last weekend. How about pasta instead?
- W: I don't want pasta.
- M: We could make hamburgers or hot dogs. Then we could go out for ice cream.
- W: Or we could just share a pizza at the restaurant near the ice cream shop.
- M: Okay Mary, that's a good idea. Let's go out for dinner, and then we'll get ice cream for dessert.

- W: We're going bowling tonight, Mark. Do you want to join us?
- M: I really should stay home and study. I have a test tomorrow, Jackie.
- W: Oh, come on! You're always studying. Come out with us and have some fun.

- W: At 5 o'clock. We're going to have an early dinner and then go bowling for a few hours. We usually have coffee afterwards, but you could leave early to study instead.
- M: Well, I guess I could use a break tonight. I can get up in the morning to study. All right, I'll just join you guys for dinner and bowling if that's okay.
- W: No problem. It'll be fun.

- W: I know. And yesterday, the bus was 30 minutes late. Unbelievable!
- M: I'm going to complain to the driver.
- W: Me, too. I'm tired of waiting.

Dialog 9

W: Do you have a part-time job, Daisuke?

M: Yes. I work at a convenience store.

W: What do you do there?

M: I do a little of everything. When there are a lot of customers, I work the cash register. That's kind of fun. At other times, I stock the shelves. Actually, that's the only thing I don't like to do.

W: Do you have to clean the store?

M: Yeah. If someone spills or breaks something in the store, I have to clean that up. I also have to change the garbage bags when they get full. I don't mind those two jobs, though.

Passage 1

W: Can I help you sir?

M: Yes. I'd like to exchange this shirt, please.

W: Oh, what seems to be the problem?

M: Well, my wife bought it for me last week, and it's too large. I need a size smaller. I also don't like the color. I'd prefer a black one instead of this red one if possible.

W: Do you have the receipt for the shirt?

M: Yes, here you are.

W: Thank you. Okay, I can help you with this. Hmm...I don't see any black ones in your size. We do have grey, white, and blue in your size, however. And, um, we also have...red.

M: That's too bad. I already have a lot of white shirts, and I'm not really too fond of blue or grey. Well, I guess if you have red in my size, then I'll just take that. At least my wife will be happy.

W: Is there anything else I can help you with today?

M: No, that's it. Thanks for your help.

W: You're welcome.

Passage 2

M: Welcome listeners. Lately more and more Chinese people are turning to coffee, particularly Chinese people living in the US. Today, I'm speaking with Linda Wong, a Chinese business woman living here in the US who closely follows these trends. Linda, welcome to our program.

W: Thanks for having me.

M: So Linda, are you a coffee drinker or tea drinker?

W: You know, I used to drink only tea back in China. But after moving to the US, I switched to coffee.

M: Is that a growing trend among other Chinese living here in the US?

W: Yes, definitely. We're seeing that more and more Chinese people, particularly people in their 20s and 30s living in the US, have become coffee drinkers.

M: What do you think has caused the change?

W: Well, there are all the famous coffee shops here, you know, like Dunkin' Donuts and Starbucks.

M: Right.

W: And then there are all the different flavors and holiday drinks ... and, you know, it's hard to find good Chinese tea in the US. But *more* than anything, and this is true for me too, Chinese people drink coffee for social reasons.

M: For social reasons?

W: Yeah, my co-workers and I like to sit in a café and chat over a cup of coffee. For many of us, coffee is something we drink with co-workers. Tea, on the other hand, is more of a family thing.

M: That makes a lot of sense. So now that you're drinking coffee, how much coffee do you drink? Do you drink it at home?

W: Oh definitely. Now I can't start my day without a cup of coffee. When I started, it was just a cup of coffee every now and then. But at work, there's a coffee machine, so I quickly got up to three cups a day. And then it became four. That's when I knew I was addicted. In fact, if I missed my cup of coffee in the morning, I would get a headache in the afternoon. It was terrible. So now I typically just have one in the morning and then have another one in the afternoon. That's it.

M: I see. Well, thanks, Linda. I really appreciate you coming in to talk with us today.

W: Thanks for having me.

M: This concludes our program. Next week, we will be talking about a new project to increase the lion population in Zimbabwe.

Passage 3

W: Well, actually, Peter, that happened a few years later. In 2011, I was really just starting out. I was making my own chocolates, and giving them as presents to family and friends. I first started selling chocolates through a local convenience store in 2012, and then, in 2013, a cake shop invited me to sell my products at their shop. Sales were so good that the following year I opened my own chocolate store. Luckily, it was very successful, and so I opened two more stores last year, one near Read College, and the other at the airport. I'm hoping to add two more in 2017.

M: I see. So, Jenny, the city of Seattle obviously loves your chocolate! Why do you think your company has been so successful?

W: Well, that's a good question. Rather than making fancy-looking chocolates, our chocolates look a bit old-fashioned and simple. That helps us keep our chocolate affordable. I suppose some people like our free samples, too.

M: I know I do!

W: But I think the biggest reason is that all our chocolates are organic. We don't use any chemicals, which makes our chocolates healthier.

M: Right. And for the ‘perfect’ ending to our little interview, have you by any chance brought any um ... chocolate samples with you?

W: You know I have. You’ve been staring at them all through the interview! Here you are.

Passage 4
