Listening 14

You will hear a man named Sean being interviewed by a radio announcer called Erika about an English camp Sean is running. Look at the 5 sentences below. Decide if each sentence is **TRUE** or **FALSE**. If it is **TRUE**, choose (A). If it is **FALSE**, choose (B).

Erika: We are lucky to have in the studio today, Sean O'Brien. Sean is arranging an international English camp for first to third-year Japanese senior high school students for the spring vacation. Sean, this will be your third year for you to operate the camp, won't it?

Sean: Yes, that's right, Erika. The camp opened for the first time 2 years ago in the spring and we're planning to offer the camp again at the same time this year. We did think about doing a summer camp too. But in the end, we dropped that idea because we didn't have enough time to prepare for this year.

Erika: So, what activities can the high school students look forward to this year?

Sean: Well, once again we'll have teachers coming in who will lead English conversation classes. We will also be introducing lots of fun projects – things that the students can do together in small groups.

Erika: Are you planning to do the drama project again?

Sean: We were thinking of having students write and perform their own drama, but we decided to add some new activities instead. The main thing is that we want the students to do as many things in English as possible.

Erika: That sounds fun. So, how long is the camp?

Sean: We actually have two options. Students can stay for a one-week camp, or for two weeks if they want. There'll be different things to do every week, so the students won't be repeating the same activities. We aren't able to accept students for just a weekend or a single day. We believe that students need to attend the camp for at least a full week to improve their English skills.

Erika: So, if a student would like to join the camp, what should they do?

Sean: They should go to our website and fill in the application form online. They should do it as soon as possible because there's a big demand. After confirming the reservation, we'll send a card in the mail.
