Listening 7

- M: Excuse me, my name is Darren Costanza. I have an appointment with the guidance counselor, Elaine Seinfeld.
- W: That's me. Come on in.
- M: I really appreciate you taking the time to talk to me about university. I'll be the first person in my family to go to university, and frankly, I'm a bit scared.
- W: That's natural. Have a seat and tell me what concerns you.
- M: Well, to start off, what do you think are the biggest differences between high school and university?
- W: I'd say the biggest difference is the level of independence you have. In high school, you have teachers who help you manage your studies. But at university, you're responsible for your own learning and time management. There's also a lot more flexibility in terms of what you study and when you study it. But the workload is heavier and there will be professors who give long reading assignments, so it's important to manage your time wisely and not leave homework until the last minute. Most professors are not that easy to meet outside of class even if they have office hours.
- M: That makes sense. I'm going to London King's College, which means I have to live away from home.
- W: Living away from home was hard for me when I was a student. I had to do my own cooking, cleaning, and budgeting. The last one is going to be a real challenge for you as London's the most expensive place to live in in the country. It might take some time to make friends, but in London you'll meet people from all over the world and have a lot of fun.
- M: I see. Do you have any final advice for me?

W: There's always something going on at university. There're clubs, societies, sports teams, events and parties. Balancing your social life and your studies might be a challenge at times. But if you feel homesick or stressed, it's important to remember to reach out for support there. At university, aside from your academic advisor, there are student counseling services and the Student Union.

Listening 8

M: Welcome to Tea Time, the world's number 1 podcast about everything to do with tea. Today, we have a special guest with us, Wei Jane, the owner of an English teashop located in the heart of Osaka. As we'll find out, it's quickly gaining a reputation for setting trends in the kinds of teas it uses, too. So Wei Jane, welcome to the podcast.

W: Thanks for inviting me, Tom.

M: Now I understand you're from China, Wei Jane, so I'm curious as to what made you choose Osaka as the location for your English teashop.

W: Well Tom, my love of tea all started when my family moved to London when I was a teenager. And I loved going to English teashops when I was there. Later, I came to Japan to study international relations at Osaka University, but after four years of living here, I hadn't been able to find a teashop that truly satisfied me. There were one or two nice teashops and some French cafés that served English tea that were okay, but none that felt truly authentic, that felt truly English. I felt Osaka really needed one, if only to give people a chance to relax and take a break from city life.

M: That makes a lot of sense. So Wei, your teashop only serves organic teas grown in Japan, yet you have over 20 different teas on the menu. How easy was it to find growers in Japan? And can you talk us through that decision?

W: Yes, this was a big challenge, and looking back I'm not sure I would make the same choice again. Initially, customers weren't familiar with organic teas and, to be honest, probably didn't even care if they were organic or not. What's more, finding organic tea growers in Japan was demanding. Japan doesn't have the exact

same certifications as other countries when it comes to organic produce either, so it's hard to know if growers are truly organic or not. That was something I discovered early on in the process. But it was important to me to serve only organic teas. I find there's a huge difference in taste between the two.

M: So I gather it wasn't an easy beginning for your teashop.

W: No, not at all! I spent a lot of time researching and visiting tea farms to find the best growers and teas. It took me over a year before I had all the teas I wanted to offer, but now I'm completely happy with what we have on our menu. We have everything from organic Earl Grey grown in Shizuoka to unique blends of English Breakfast tea that we've created ourselves from tea grown in Kyoto.

M: Do you have any plans to expand and open more teashops?

W: No, I like creating a personalized experience for each customer who visits the teashop. My focus is on keeping the quality of both the tea and our service as high as possible and I'd rather put my time into improving what we have rather than expanding. But I have recently opened an online shop where people can buy the teas we serve in the teashop. We also offer tea classes and workshops, where customers can learn more about the teas we serve and how to prepare them.

M: Well, thank you, Wei Jane, for sharing your story and insights with us today.

Scott: What shall we do with Daisy while we are on vacation in Madrid? We'll be gone for a week and someone needs to take care of her.

Zelda: True. We can't leave her on her own, can we? How about finding her a pet hotel?

Scott: Hmm...those are only for cats and dogs, not really for lizards.

Zelda: I don't think so. They'll look after any kind of animal as long as they have instructions. I was looking at some online earlier actually...here, look at this website.

Listening 10

W: Are you looking to do something different this summer? Would you be interested in working with elephants? Then the Elephant Refuge Park in Thailand might be just the place for you! We are an elephant park located 160 kilometers southwest of Bangkok. The Elephant Refuge Park is home to 20 Asian elephants. The majority of them were rescued from poor working conditions in the tourism industry. Although these elephants cannot be returned to the wild, the park gives the elephants lots of space to live.

Volunteer duties include feeding and washing the elephants and cleaning and doing other maintenance work around the park. If interested, keep in mind the following points. You must be at least 18 years old. You should be in good physical condition as you'll need to walk a lot in a hot and humid climate. You also need to speak and listen to English well enough to communicate with our staff and other volunteers. A positive attitude toward group living, teamwork and especially animal welfare is necessary, though experience working with animals is not required.

All our volunteers stay in guest houses, just a five-minute walk through the park to the Elephant Refuge Visitor Center. Guest houses include a bedroom for each of the four volunteers as well as a shared bathroom with a toilet and shower. Three meals a day are provided, but each guest house also includes a kitchen if residents wish to make their own meals. Your accommodation at the park will be pretty basic but comfortable.

Please note that all stays require a minimum commitment of 1 week. The maximum booking length at any one time is 12 weeks. The volunteer fee for a one-week stay is \$400 and covers the cost of your accommodation, your meals, as well as the animals' food and care. To be considered as a volunteer with us, you can complete the application form on our website. Thank you for your interest in our organization.
