Listening 7

- M: You know, Ruby turns six next month. I was thinking we should have a party.

- M: So we'd better start planning! What kind of food would be good? I guess everyone loves pizza, right?

Listening 8

- M: Thank you for taking the time to join us today.
- W: It's my pleasure.
- M: Now, why don't you tell us about what you collect?
- W: Certainly. I collect flags. Of course, I've been aware of our country's flag since I was in kindergarten, but it wasn't until I was in junior high school that my interest really started. I remember there was a big poster with all the flags of the world on the wall in my geography class, and I was fascinated by it. At first, I just wanted to memorize all the flags. It wasn't easy, but eventually, I was able to name every country's flag from memory.
- M: Wow, that's amazing.

You will hear a man called Sanjay talking to a woman called Zara about their son, Amir. Look at the 5 sentences below. Decide if each sentence is **TRUE** or **FALSE**. If it is **TRUE**, choose (A). If it is **FALSE**, choose (B). You now have 20 seconds to preview the questions.

Listening 9 will now begin.

- M: Is Amir home from school yet? It's kind of late, isn't it?
W: He should be home from practice soon. The football team has got a match this weekend, so they have been training hard every day this week.
M: Will the match be home or away?
W: Home. Will you be around on Saturday afternoon? We can go and watch him.
M: I'm going to be away at a conference, remember? I'm leaving for Osaka on Friday night, and I'll be there until Sunday afternoon.
W: Oh yeah, I totally forgot! That's a shame. Amir will never say it, but I know he's really keen for us to watch him play, especially since his team is doing so well at the moment.
M: I know. But at least you'll be there. Have you got a list of the rest of his matches? If I know what games are coming up, I can arrange to be free and at least catch some of them.
W: I'm not sure, but why don't you ask him yourself? He must have it somewhere. He'll be pleased if you ask.
M: Okay, I will. I think that's him coming in now. I just heard the front gate open!
W: Poor kid, he must be tired! Go and get the bath ready so he can get straight in.

Decide if each sentence is **TRUE** or **FALSE**. If it **TRUE** choose (A). If it is **FALSE**, choose (B). You now have 20 seconds to preview the questions.

Listening 10 will now begin.

- M: Good morning. Thank you for calling the Four Seasonings Hotel. This is the Weddings and Celebrations Service, how may I help you?
W: Hello, I'm an administrator at Carleton University and I'm in charge of organizing a party for our university's graduating students. I'd like to reserve a large banquet room at the Four Seasonings for our celebrations.

- M: I see, madam. When were you thinking of holding the event, and for how many people?
- W: Well, ideally, we would like to hold it on the last Saturday or Sunday of this March. We'd like to book a room for the event from 7:00 till 9:00 in the evening.
- M: I see...
- W: And we're expecting between 80 and 100 people to attend.
- M: Okay, well perhaps we could try and decide on a room for your event now, and then we could discuss menus and food later on?
- W: Sounds good to me. What do you have available?
- M: Well madam, for the Saturday we only have two large rooms available, the *Ponzu Room* and the *Miso Room*. They're both taken on Sunday, but we do have two other rooms if you decide to hold the event then. We have the *Dashi Room* and the *Wasabi Room*. Of course, they are a little more expensive...
- W: Okay, so how much would it cost to reserve these rooms?
- M: Well, for two hours, the charge for the *Ponzu Room* would be \$300 and for the *Miso* \$350. We charge \$400 for the *Dashi Room*. The *Wasabi Room* is rather more expensive at \$500 but, unlike the others, it is on the top floor of the hotel and it has wonderful views over the city and the harbour.
- W: Hmmm... I see. And how about food? What options do we have?
- M: Okay, so you can choose from several different menu options for your graduation party. The number of dishes will vary according to the price of course, but even the cheapest menu comes with a good selection of non-alcoholic drinks. Rather than go through all the menu options over the phone, if you give me your contact details I could e-mail you the specific details of each menu right away.
- W: Thank you that would be very helpful. I would have preferred a Saturday booking, but actually, having the party in a room overlooking the city and harbour at night would make it truly memorable for our graduates, so yes, please do e-mail me all the details so that I can set this up. I should be able to let you know about our choice of room and menus tomorrow afternoon.
- M: Excellent, I'm sure that whatever your choices, your guests will not be disappointed.
